They have seen the Map showing the Archaeological sites in Tamilnadu, Excavated tools and weapons of stone age, pictures showing River Valley Civilization in Tamilnadu, History of Madurai, and Keeladi displayed in the Museum.

They enjoyed the virtual museum holds a replica of Chettinadu Architecture and Six Galleries titled “Agrarian and water management, Ceramic Industries, Weaving and Beads, Sea trade, Past time and life style. About Dinamalar

Dinamalar is an Indian Tamil daily newspaper. It was founded in 1951 by T.V. Ramasubba Iyer. Dinamalar, a Tamil newspaper, with a readership of 11.65 million, is the third most read Tamil newspaper and ninth most read regional newspaper. The newspaper is printed in 10 cities in Tamil Nadu namely Chennai, Coimbatore, Erode, Madurai, Nagercoil, Pondicherry, Salem, Tiruchirappalli, Tirunelveli, Vellore and Bangalore. As of April 2023, the Newspaper has a circulation of 693,742. In June 2022, the newspaper has a circulation of 1,731,8959 and more than 2 million e-paper subscribers.

Industrial Visit

On 16th March 2024, Department of History, ADM College for Women (A), Nagapattinam organized an industrial visit to Dinamalar Daily, Press, Head Office at Tiruchirappalli. The group consisted of 7 students and 2 faculty members from Department of History, ADM College for Women (A), Nagapattinam.

The industrial visit started with a brief session about the overall functions of a newspaper such as gathering news and editing principles. Mr. K. Chandrasekar, Editorial Head, explained the career in Journalism and the qualities of a Journalist. At the visit students were provided with an opportunity to witness newsroom and different departments in a Press. Mrs. S. Tamilselvi, Computer Operator and Mr. R. Krishnamoorthy, Sub-editor gave a practical exposure of showing the Newsroom and its working. Students interacted with them and acquired knowledge on Headlines, Lead, Beats and working of Beats. Department of History organized field visit to Government Museum at Thiruvarur District on 18.03.2024. Mrs. R. Alamelu, HOD/Associate Professor, Dr. R. Devi, Dr. C. R. Rathika, Assistant Professors in History, & 27 first year UG Students participated.

Mr. P. Manimuthu, District Curator welcomed the gathering. He explained about Museum and the job opportunities of studying Museology, and showed all the exhibits in the museum among the students. He revealed some of the notable collections including Bronze & stone sculptures, coins and Inscriptions, Wooden Artifacts, Paintings and Manuscripts, Ethnographic Exhibits.

In the Museum, Bronze sculptures dated back to the Cholas period, Stone sculptures depicting various deities, Mythological scenes, and everyday life from different periods of Tamil Nadu history.

Students are excited in seeing Wood Carvings, Fiber products, Photographs of Medicinal plants, marine Products, especially types of Fishes, various types of Conch Shells, Photographs of Python skins and Leather Toys, ancient stone weapons etc. Fossils of 70 million years such as fossil wood, plant fossil, stigmatophygus were exhibited.



The Museum displays a range of ancient coins and inscriptions that provide insights into the economic and cultural practices of ancient Tamil society. Wooden artifacts such as intricately carved doors, panels reflect the traditional wood craft of the region. Students have enjoyed the Museum visit and acquired practical knowledge on Museology.

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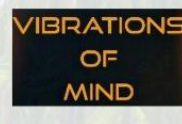

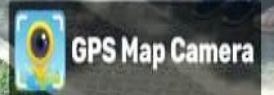

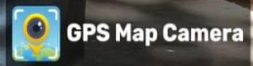

Educational Tour Report (2023-2024)

Date: 07.03.2024

Location: Thanjavur and Trichy, Tamilnadu, India

Purpose of the Educational Tour:

The Educational tour to Thanjavur Big Temple and Aringar Anna Sugar Factory aimed to provide students with insights into South Indian Architecture, History and Culture heritage and students with practical insights into the process of sugar production, industrial operations and environmental sustainability practices.

Learning Outcomes:

Educational Tour Journey to Thanjavur and Trichy was started 6.30AM from college with 20 students and 3 staffs. First visited Thanjavur' Big Temple. The trip fostered an appreciation for South Indian Culture, Architecture and religious traditions among the students. Students gained a deeper understanding of the historical context of the Chola dynasty and its contributions to Indian art and architecture. Examining the temple's intricate carvings and sculptures enhanced students' artistic sensibility and aesthetic appreciation. Observing religious practices at the temple facilitated a greater awareness and understanding of Hinduism and its rituals. Next the team reached Aringar Anna Sugar Factory, Kurungulam. Students understood the industrial-scale production process of sugar from raw sugarcane. They appreciated the role of technology and engineering in optimizing efficiency and quality in sugar manufacturing. Students got awareness of the environmental impact of sugar production and the importance of sustainable practices. Note making was done by the students and they developed it into a report after visiting the factory.

Recommendations:

Encourage follow-up discussions or projects related to sustainable practices in sugar production and historical experience.

3. **Networking Opportunities:** The visit facilitated networking with experts in the field, potentially opening up future opportunities.

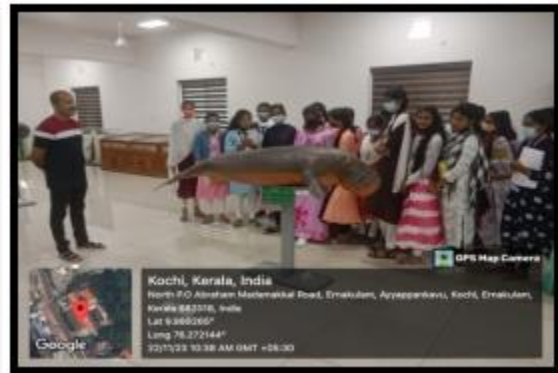

Industrial Visit to National Institute of Food Technology and Entrepreneurship Management (NIFTEM-T)

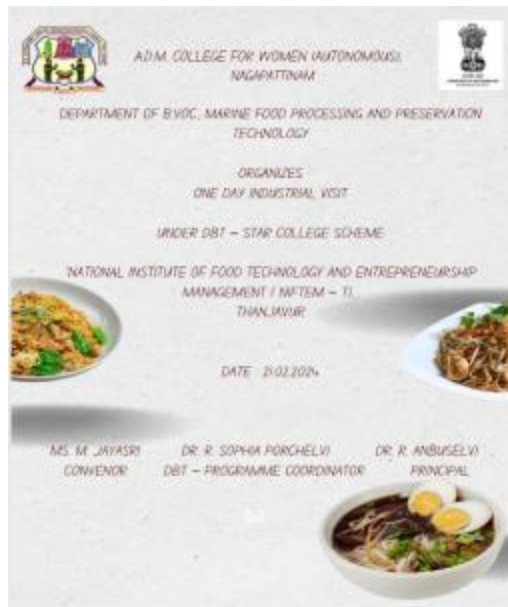
An industrial visit to the National Institute of Food Technology and Entrepreneurship Management (NIFTEM-T), Thanjavur, was organized on 21.02.2024.

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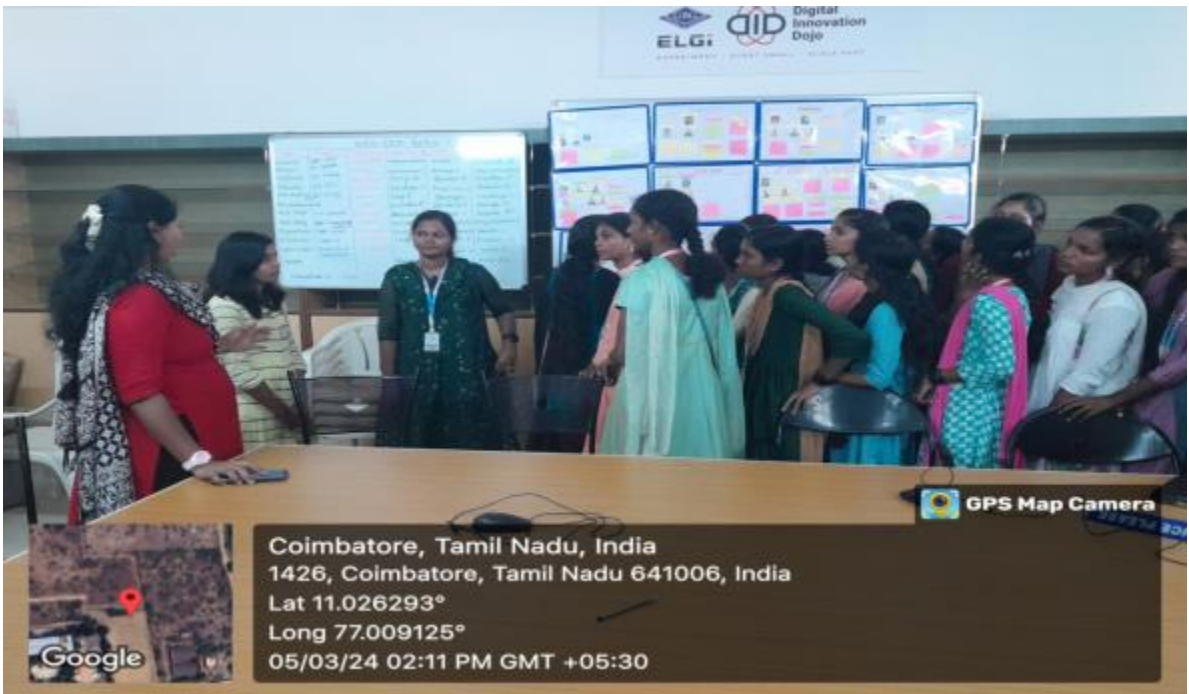

REPORT

The Department of Business Administration has organized a Industry Visit programme on 07.03.2024 to Arignar Anna Sugar Mill at Thanjavur. 52 Students were taken to visit the Industry along with 2 Staff members.

At first students were taken to the Thanjavur's Big Temple. The trip fostered an appreciation for South Indian Culture, Architecture and religious traditions among the students. Students experienced the historical context of the Chola dynasty and its contributions to Indian art and architecture. Students examined the temple's intricate carvings and sculptures which enhanced artistic sensibility and aesthetic appreciation. They observed religious practices at the temple facilitated a greater awareness and understanding of Hinduism and its rituals.

At next the team were reached the Arignar Anna Sugar Mill in kurungulam, Thanjavur, produces some fine Sugar and marbled paper from cotton rag pulp. Over a half –a – century old, Sri Aurobindo Handmade Paper Factory makes and sells eco – friendly handmade paper in various colours along with stationery and gift boxes. Students understood the industrial-scale production process of sugar from raw sugarcane. They examined the role of technology and engineering in optimizing efficiency and quality in sugar manufacturing. Students got awareness of the environment impact of sugar production and importance of sustainable practices.
